



ANNEXES



1) Exhibitor obligations

The exhibitor is obliged to comply strictly with the provisions of safety regulations and those specific to the event, as specified in the specifications sent to him by the organizer.

Fittings must be completed at the time of the acceptance visit by the safety officer (in the case of a standard configuration) or by the Departmental Safety Commission (in the case of a different configuration). The exhibitor must take all necessary steps to ensure that these arrangements can be examined in detail. The exhibitor or his qualified representative must be present during this inspection. He must make available to the safety officer and/or members of the Departmental Safety Commission any information concerning the installations and materials making up the stand, except for those covered by a recognized quality mark.

The exhibitor must submit requests for special authorization or specific declarations to the safety officer or the Prefect, within the legal deadlines.

2) Booth layout

Protection of structures :

Access, circulation and spaces used to transport materials from unloading points to the event site must be protected:

- Use of carts or other handling equipment with rubber tires,
 - Use of weight-distribution floors
 - Protection of carpets with a resistant coating to prevent punching.
- No fixtures that could damage the supports (floors, walls, posts, ceilings) will be allowed.

Frame and partitions :

All materials classified M0, M1, M2 and M3 are authorized for the construction of framing and stand partitions. In accordance with the decree of June 30, 1983, the conventional classification of wood-based materials admits that the following are considered as corresponding to the characteristics of M3 materials:

- Solid non-coniferous wood, thickness 14 mm or more,

- Solid softwood, 18mm thick or thicker,
- Wood-derived panels (plywood, particleboard, etc.) with a thickness of 18 mm or more.

Extendable, sliding and removable partitions:

Extendable, sliding and removable partitions must be rated M3.

Wall coverings:

M0, M1, M2 coverings (natural textiles or plastics) can be stretched and fixed with staples.

Miscellaneous coverings (fabric, paper, plastic film) of medium or high flammability, of very thin thickness (1 mm maximum) must be glued to solid M0, M1, M2 or M3 substrates.

In all cases are prohibited within the Centre de Congrès Pierre Baudis:

- Soft cellulose agglomerates,
- Expanded plastic sheets, panels or foils that are not at least M2 classified,
- Coatings that are not at least M2-rated.

Floor coverings :

Floor coverings must be made of materials with a minimum M4 rating and be securely fixed. However, they must be of at least M3 category for horizontal and vertical coverings with a total surface area of more than 20 m² and for podiums, stands and bleachers over 0.30 m high.

Curtains, drapes and sheers:

Curtains, drapes and net curtains can be floating if they are M0, M1 or M2. They are not permitted on stand entrance doors, but are authorized on booth doors. The materials exhibited may be presented without any reaction to fire requirements, except if they are used to decorate partitions or false ceilings, and if their total surface area exceeds 20% of the total surface area of these structures.

In this case, they must meet the requirements of the preceding paragraph for partitions, and of the following paragraph for canopies, ceilings and false ceilings. However, these provisions do not apply to specific interior design fairs, exhibitions and stands where textiles and wall coverings are present.

Velumas, ceilings and false ceilings:

Velumas must be made of M0 or M1 materials. They must also be supported by a network of wires, forming meshes no larger than 1 square metre. Ceilings and false ceilings must be made of M0 or M1 materials. They must not interfere with the operation of fire detection and smoke extraction systems.

Floral decoration:

Floral decorations in synthetic materials must be limited. Otherwise, such decorations must be made of M2-category materials. These provisions do not apply to trade shows and stands specifically for floral activities.

Floating decorative elements :

Floating decorative elements (billboards larger than 0.50 m², garlands, light decorative objects, etc.) must be made of M0 or M1 materials, or be made fireproof. The use of white lettering on a green background is absolutely forbidden; these colors are reserved exclusively for indicating "exits" and "emergency exits".

Furniture :

There are no requirements for standard furniture (tables, chairs, desks, etc.). Reaction-to-fire certificates: All materials used must have a reaction-to-fire certificate issued by a French laboratory, less than 5 years old. Excluded from this requirement are so-called "traditional" materials, and materials bearing a quality mark from a certifying body (NF, etc.). Fireproofing may only be carried out on wood panels, natural fabrics or fabrics with a high proportion of natural fibers. It cannot be applied to plastic or synthetic materials. A fireproofing report is supplied by the applicator, stipulating his approval to issue such a document.



Closed stands:

Closed stands must have direct access to the aisles. The number and width of these exits depend on the size of the stand, and must comply with at least the following provisions:

Less than 20 m²

1 exit of 0.90 m.

From 20 to 50 m²

2 exits: one 0.90 m, the other 0.60 m.

From 50 to 100 m²

- 2 exits of 0.90 m.
- OR 2 exits, one 1.40 m, the other 0.60 m.

From 100 to 200 m²

- 2 exits : one 1,40 m, the other de 0,90 m.
- OR 3 exits of 0,90 m.

From 200 to 300 m²

2 exits of 1.40 m.

From 300 to 400 m²

2 exits: one 1.40 m, the other 1.80 m.

Exits should be well spaced out and, if possible, opposite each other. Each exit must be marked "SORTIE" in white letters on a green background. If the stand is closed by doors, these must open in the direction of the exit, without a locking system and without opening onto the public aisle.

If the stand is covered, the provisions of article T23 below must be observed.

Covered stands, raised stands:

Stands with a ceiling, false ceiling or full canopy, as well as those with a raised level, must :

- Have a surface area of less than 300m²,
- Have a distance between them equal to or greater than 4m,
- Have a total surface area of ceiling and suspended ceiling (including that of raised levels) of no more than

equal to 10% of the surface area of the level concerned.
Each stand may have only one raised level.

If the stand area exceeds 50m², it must :

- Be equipped with self-contained safety lighting at all exits,
- Have appropriate fire extinguishing equipment permanently manned by at least one security guard, while the public is present,
- Ambient lighting if the surface area exceeds 100 m².

3) Electrical installations

Responsibilities :

Exhibitors are responsible for the electrical installations and connections made in their stands by themselves or on their behalf.

The electrical box is used in accordance with its intended purpose, taking into account its technical characteristics and capacities, including the controlled power.

Semi-permanent electrical installations must comply with the regulations set out in article T35.

Similarly, the only possible connection to a stand is via the box provided exclusively for the stand.

Special stand installations :

Special stand installations must be carried out by persons who are particularly aware of the specific risks of the event, and who possess the knowledge enabling them to design and carry out the work in compliance with these regulations.

The electrical installation of each stand must be protected at its origin against overcurrents and ground faults.

All metallic grounds must be interconnected and grounded to the stand's electrical connection box.

Electrical connections must be made inside junction boxes.

Electrical disconnecting devices must be permanently accessible to stand personnel.

Electrical equipment:

All electrical equipment must comply with French or European standards.

Electrical wiring:

Electrical cables must be insulated for a minimum rated voltage of 500 volts, which means that H 03 VHH (Sindex) cables are not permitted.

The cables used must be those in which each conductor has its own protective sheath, with all conductors housed in a common protective sheath.

Conductors with cross-sections of less than 1.5 mm² are not permitted.

All cables must have a protective conductor connected to the delivery box terminal connected to the general earthing network.

Equipment:

Class O equipment is prohibited on site. Class 1 devices must be connected to the protective conductor of the pipeline supplying them.

The use of individual protective earth connections is prohibited.

High-voltage discharge lamps are forbidden on site, except by special dispensation.

The switch provided for in article 5 of NFC 15.150 may be confused with the control device referred to in article T35 (§3) of the corresponding stand.

Socket outlets must be connected to circuits protected by overcurrent protection devices with a rated current of at least 16 A. Any appliance requiring higher power must be supplied by a specially adapted circuit.



The use of a multiple adapter or a multiple box powered from a fixed base is authorized (fly sockets are forbidden).

Illuminated signs :

Only class 2 spotlights (standard NF C 20.030) are authorized. High-voltage illuminated signs within reach of the public or personnel working on the stand must be protected, particularly the electrodes, by a screen of at least M2 material.

The emergency cut-off switch must be indicated, and transformers placed in a place where they cannot cause any danger to people. A "DANGER HIGH VOLTAGE" sign may be required to indicate their presence.

4) Flammable liquids and gases

Authorized liquids :

The use of particularly flammable liquids (ethyl oxide, carbon disulphide, etc.) is prohibited.

Only the use of 1st category flammable liquids, up to a maximum of 5 liters per stand, is authorized, as well as those of 2nd category, up to a limit of 10 litres/10 m² (with a maximum of 80 liters).

For information, gasoline falls into 1st category, fuel oil and alcohols between 40° and 60° GL into 2nd category.

The following precautions should be taken:

- Place 9 kg dry powder extinguishers nearby,
- Place a watertight receptacle under the tanks to contain all the fuel,
- Recharge the device containing the liquid when the public is not present.

Display of flammable products:

All containers of flammable liquids displayed on stands must be empty (cans of paint, varnish, bottles, aerosol cans, etc.), with the exception of a few samples in limited quantities.

Compressed gases, liquefied hydrocarbons:

The use of these products is permitted only for the specific needs of demonstrations within the framework and theme of a particular event.

Air, nitrogen and carbon dioxide cylinders are authorized without restriction.

Compressed gases and liquefied hydrocarbons may be admitted (maximum 13 kg bottle).

Cylinders in service must always be kept out of public reach and protected from impact.

They must be :

- Either separated from each other by a rigid, non-combustible screen, with a minimum of one bottle per 10 m² and a maximum of six per stand,
- or at least 5 meters apart, with a maximum of six per stand.

No unconnected bottles, empty or full, may be stored inside the establishment.

Cylinders must be either upright or lying on the floor, with the head resting on a support, so that they are slightly inclined, with the valve at the top.

Oxygen, hydrogen and acetylene cylinders are prohibited.

Pyrotechnic devices and articles:

All pyrotechnic effects generating sound detonations, sparks, flames or smoke are strictly forbidden.

5) Machines and equipment shown in operation

If machines or equipment are shown in motion, a protected area must keep the public at least one meter away from the machines; this distance may be increased on the advice of the safety officer, depending on the risks involved.

Moving parts, hot surfaces, points and cutting edges must either be protected by a rigid screen, or set back at least one meter from aisles or areas accessible to the public.

Hydraulic safety devices for equipment displayed in a high, static position must be supplemented by a mechanical device to prevent accidental folding.

All equipment must be properly stabilized to avoid any risk of tipping over.

6) Thermal or combustion engine machines, motor vehicles

Combustion gases must be vented to the outside in a manner approved by the dealer. The installations must be shut down as soon as the demonstrations are over.

Inside the Centre de Congrès Pierre Baudis, the tanks of gasoline-powered vehicles must be empty.

If they are not fitted with an anti-theft cap, an adhesive strip must prevent them from being opened.

Alarm systems must be disconnected.

Accumulator batteries must be disconnected and the terminals made inaccessible. Floors must be protected.

7) Radioactive substances, X-rays

Any display of machines or equipment using radioactive substances or generating X-rays must be submitted by the exhibitor to the relevant authorities for authorization.

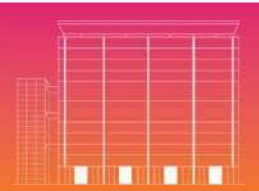
The provisions of article T43 of the Safety Regulations must be complied with. Stands on which radioactive substances are displayed must be built and decorated with M1-category materials.

Authorization to display X-ray emitting equipment on exhibition stands may only be granted if the equipment and accessories comply with the rules set out in standard NF C 74.100.

8) Prohibited materials, products and gases

The following are prohibited on the premises of the Centre de Congrès Pierre Baudis:

- The distribution of samples or products containing flammable gas,
- Balloons inflated with flammable or toxic gas,
- Celluloid articles,
- Pyrotechnic and explosive fireworks,
- The presence of ethyl oxide, carbon sulphide, sulphuric ether and acetone.



Assembly / disassembly

During assembly and dismantling, the site is off-limits to the public.

Exhibitor access during these periods :

A wristband will be issued either directly on the delivery dock or at the site reception desk. Identity checks will be carried out by our Security and Prevention Officer before you register with the organizer.

Access to areas during these periods for exhibitors' service providers :

Each person must report to the security desk to receive a badge (in exchange for a document with the person's name and photo).

Service providers must provide a list of the names of personnel working on the site, or supply identification badges.

Unidentified persons will not have access to the site.

Essential safety rules :

During set-up and dismantling, access to exhibition and event areas is restricted.

All exhibitors must formally comply with the instructions given by the organizers and all those in charge of managing access and safety.

- It is compulsory to wear PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) throughout the show's set-up and dismantling periods.

- Emergency exits must remain clear and free of access.

- R.I.A. (Robin d'Incendie Armés) must remain accessible at all times.

The internal regulations (cf. appendix 3) must be complied with or penalties will be imposed.



Ladders, stepladders and steps may not be used as continuous workstations.

Using a cherry picker:

The use of a cherry picker is subject to current regulations.

The driver and attendant must wear a helmet. The driver must be in possession of a CACES or equivalent authorization: driving authorization issued by the employer after verification of medical fitness (annual certificate) and a practical training test. They must be over 18 years of age.

These documents will be checked by the Safety HQ before use.



Conditions of use for aerial work platforms :

- Maximum weight 1.6t
- Mandatory presentation of documents (Caces A and employer's driving authorization) to be presented to the safety center.

The attendant and the driver must also be in possession of these documents.

Stand surveillance :

General surveillance during the show is the responsibility of the organizer. We recommend that you have your installations watched over, especially at night, and remind you that the risk of theft is high during the dismantling and dismantling period. Please be careful with your personal belongings.

A prevention and security agent can be commissioned on request to watch over your stand (please contact our service for a stand guarding service to suit your needs)



All persons entering the Centre de Congrès Pierre Baudis (CCPB) must comply with the present regulations.

CHAPTER 1 - SCOPE OF APPLICATION

Article 1 - Persons concerned

These rules and regulations apply to all persons entering the CCPB, including customers, event organizers and their guests or participants in any capacity whatsoever, the public, contractors and their staff, and the staff of Toulouse Congrès, the site manager, this list not being exhaustive.

Any person present in the CCPB without title or authorization shall be subject to these rules, without prejudice to any civil and/or criminal proceedings that may be taken against them as a result of their unauthorized presence.

Article 2 - Applicable provisions

Toulouse Congrès is the venue operator.

The general provisions of these regulations apply to all persons present on the premises of the CCPB in any capacity whatsoever. The provisions for visitors apply to all persons present by virtue of a paid ticket, invitation or right of use issued by the show producer or event organizer concerned, or by the management of Toulouse Congrès.

The provisions specific to beneficiaries and service providers apply to any individual or legal entity holding a right to use or operate the CCPB and, more generally, to any economic agent involved in any capacity whatsoever in the CCPB by virtue of a service contract linking him/her directly to Toulouse Congress or to one of its beneficiaries or service providers.

Article 3 - Amendment of the present regulations

The management of Toulouse Congrès reserves the right to modify all or part of these rules at any time for reasons of security, service improvement or to take into account legislative, regulatory or legal developments. The modified rules are applicable as soon as they are integrated into the Toulouse Congrès website.

CHAPTER 2 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 4 - Legal proceedings

Non-compliance with the rules set out in these regulations shall engage the civil liability of its author. The author will also be held criminally liable insofar as this is provided for by law or regulation. In both cases, legal action may be taken.

Article 5 - Authorized persons

All persons present in the CCPB must hold an authorization or attendance card recognized by the operator of the premises. No other person is authorized to enter the premises. All persons wishing to enter the site are subject to inspection.

Article 6 - Personal items

All persons present in the CCPB retain custody of their belongings. The management of Toulouse Congrès declines all responsibility in the event of theft, damage or loss of personal belongings that spectators, organizers or other members of the public may bring into the building or its surroundings.

Article 7 - Site access control

When entering and leaving the facility, users must comply with the instructions given by reception and security staff.

In accordance with current legislation, security personnel holding a professional card number issued by the Conseil National des Activités Privées de Sécurité (CNAPS) may be required to carry out a visual inspection and a thorough search of bags and luggage with the owner's consent, and to pat down visitors in order to prevent dangerous objects from entering the premises. All visitors are required to comply with these searches and pat-downs, failing which they will be denied access to the CCPB. Members of the public are required to undergo checks at the entrance and inside the CCPB.

Article 8 - Weapons by type and destination

For safety reasons, it is strictly forbidden to bring onto the site any weapons, explosive, flammable or volatile substances, bottles, containers, sharp or blunt objects, pyrotechnic items (except for certain fireworks linked to the scenography of an event) and, in general,

any object that is dangerous or liable to be used as a projectile. If the owner of an unauthorized object refuses to part with it, access to the establishment will be refused without reimbursement of the ticket. Security staff and ticket inspectors are the sole judges of whether an object is authorized or not..

Article 9 - Deposit box

Unauthorized items in the CCPB will be recorded by security staff at the entrance to the facility.

In the event of loss of the numbered ticket, users are not entitled to reclaim any items deposited until they have been passed on to the Toulouse lost and found department.

Glass bottles, aluminum cans, perishable foodstuffs and their containers will, however, be deposited in non-returnable waste garbage cans.

All items found or forgotten in the consigned area must be returned to Toulouse Congrès management to be kept for a period of 30 days, pending recovery by the owner. Once this period has elapsed, they will be passed on to the City of Toulouse's lost and found department. The name of the inventor will be forwarded to the city council.

Items whose possession or carrying is prohibited on the public highway (weapons, narcotics, etc.) may not be deposited in the locker. If found, they must be reported to the police.

If an item is refused entry to the locker due to lack of capacity or incompatibility with the safety of the premises, the owner must dispose of it in a way that preserves the safety and integrity of third parties before being allowed to enter the CCPB.

Unless specifically authorized by the show producer or event organizer, cameras are not permitted inside the CCPB.

Article 10 - Privileged areas

The media/public relations areas, dressing rooms and VIP areas are only accessible to persons in possession of an entry permit (invitation, ticket, badge, etc.). A control is carried out at the entrance to these areas.



Article 11 - Security service

For reasons of safety, emergency or to ensure the proper functioning of the public service, visitors/spectators must strictly comply with the instructions of CCPB safety personnel, whose mission is to ensure the necessary intervention in the event of incident, accident, fire, violence, evacuation of the building and application of the present regulations.

Article 12 - Emergency resources

It is forbidden to obstruct or prevent access to mobile or fixed fire-fighting equipment (extinguishers, etc.). It is formally forbidden to obscure in any way whatsoever the marked emergency exits or to obstruct access to them. Except in the event of an emergency, it is forbidden to use the emergency exits.

Article 13 - Evacuation

In the event of a major incident or situation endangering the safety of spectators, organizers, delegates and all other personnel present in the building, such as a major technical problem, fire, bomb threat or discovery of a suspicious package, evacuation of the CCPB will be triggered by an audible alarm.

If evacuation of the building becomes necessary, it must be carried out in an orderly and disciplined manner under the supervision of security and safety personnel and evacuation managers, in accordance with the instructions given by the latter.

To ensure that evacuation takes place as quickly and safely as possible, visitors must immediately and calmly make their way to the emergency exits provided and be guided out by the hall's security staff.

Fire alarms may only be activated if necessary. Any person abusing this will be held civilly and criminally liable.

Article 14 - Personal health

CCPB users are asked to report any accident or illness to the facility's staff. No one who does not possess the medical skills required by a state diploma or first-aid certificate may move the sick or injured person, make him drink or administer any medication before the arrival of the emergency services.

A defibrillator is available on level 0 in the immediate vicinity of the central security station, at the site entrance.

Article 15 - Unloading dock

On the unloading dock and its internal access roads, the Highway Code applies. Vehicles must travel at a very low speed, in any case less than 10km/hour, enabling them to stop immediately in all circumstances.

Vehicles located on the CCPB unloading dock remain under the care of their owners. No obligation or responsibility is transferred to Toulouse Congrès as a result of Toulouse Congrès' tolerance of the use of this dock. Toulouse Congrès does not assume responsibility for supervision, and it is the responsibility of vehicle owners to take all necessary precautions to limit risks (theft, damage, etc.) and/or to take out appropriate insurance. We recommend that no objects be left unattended in the vehicles. The management of Toulouse Congrès declines all responsibility in the event of theft or damage.

Authorized motor vehicles must take all necessary steps to avoid obstructing the work of security services and other users. The Toulouse Congrès management reserves the right to have obstructing vehicles moved; the costs will be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Article 16 - Cleanliness

Users of the CCPB must respect the cleanliness of the facilities and their external surroundings. It is forbidden to throw away paper, food, chewing gum or any other garbage likely to soil or damage the premises.

Article 17 - Expression

Documents, leaflets, badges, insignia, symbols or banners of any size or nature of a racist, xenophobic, political or religious propaganda nature are forbidden by the Toulouse Congrès management, who will take all necessary measures, including the expulsion of any person not respecting this ban, unless prior authorization has been obtained from Toulouse Congrès,

tany promotional or advertising operation is forbidden in the CCPB. This includes, but is not limited to, the installation of visual advertising objects, the distribution of documents of any kind, the wearing of clothing or accessories bearing the colors of a brand, product, service or company, and more generally the use of techniques designed to convey any message for advertising or information purposes.

All opinion polls conducted on the premises are subject to the prior authorization of the Toulouse Congrès management.

Article 18 - Public order

Any person in a manifest state of intoxication, attempting to introduce alcoholic beverages by force or by fraud, using or under the influence of narcotics, smoking on the CCPB premises, including in the auditorium, reception hall, toilets, administrative offices, backstage and technical areas, and inside and outside emergency exits, or seriously disturbing public order through violent or dangerous behavior or in any way whatsoever, will be denied access to the CCPB or expelled.

As a general rule, all users of the CCPB are asked to avoid causing any disturbance whatsoever to the smooth running of events or their visit, through their attitude, dress or words, and to respect safety regulations. Any offenders may be referred to the police.

Article 19 - CCPB image

All users of the CCPB agree not to do or say anything that could damage the reputation of the CCPB, the Zenith, Toulouse Congrès, the city and its metropolitan area, in France or worldwide. The user also agrees not to denigrate or harm the image of the artists in the CCPB's program.

Article 20 - Photography and recording

Cameras and sound recordings may not be taken in the CCPB without the express prior authorization of the event organizer and the persons concerned.



Similarly, the technical installations and equipment may not be photographed, filmed or recorded without authorization from the Toulouse Congrès management.

Article 21 - Video surveillance

The CCPB is equipped with a video surveillance system.

Article 22 - Lost children

Any lost child will be taken to the security center. If necessary, and in any event after the CCPB has closed, the lost child will be handed over to the Police.

Article 23 - Animals

Animals are not allowed. However, guide dogs accompanying holders of a disability card bearing the word "blind" are accepted.

Article 24 - Displacement

It is forbidden to breach posted defences. It is forbidden to run, jostle, climb or cling to walls, enclosures, security or demarcation gates.

Article 25 - Travel assistance

With the exception of wheelchairs for the sick or disabled that do not use flammable fuels, no means of transport are allowed in the CCPB (baby carriages, prams, rollerblades, etc.)

Article 26 - Respect for the premises

The premises must be used in accordance with their purpose and the contract binding the user to the CCPB. A complaint will be lodged against any person who damages the premises or equipment. Any theft of equipment will be prosecuted.

Article 27 - Mobile phone

The use of cell phones is forbidden on the premises, unless the organizer of the event(s) in question agrees. In any event, cell phone users must ensure that they do not disturb other users of the site.

Article 28 - Liability

The management of Toulouse Congrès declines all responsibility in the event of damage caused by persons present on the premises or objects owned, held or possessed by them.

CHAPTER 3 - PROVISIONS FOR VISITORS

Article 29 - Title

All visitors must be in possession of a paid ticket, an invitation or an easement issued by the producer of the event concerned or by the management of Toulouse Congrès. The event producer may not authorize access after the start time.

Article 30 - Expulsion

The management of Toulouse Congrès reserves the right to expel any person contravening any of the clauses of the present regulations, with the exclusion of any refund of the admission ticket, without prejudice to any legal proceedings against the offender. Spectators are required to comply with any instructions printed on the admission ticket.

Article 31 - Exit

All exits are definitive, except in exceptional cases when a counter-mark valid only with the ticket counterfoil will be issued.

Article 32 - Cancellation

In the event of cancellation or postponement of the event, any ticket refund will be made at the place of purchase and subject to the conditions of the event organizer.

Article 33 - Right of access

The title by virtue of which its holder has a right of access to the CCPB strictly delimits his right of access, to the exclusion of any other space. It is forbidden to cross the devices designed to contain the public.

CHAPTER 4 - PROVISIONS SPECIFIC TO BENEFICIARIES AND SERVICE PROVIDERS

Article 34 - Title

Beneficiaries or service providers, as well as any person present on the premises on their behalf (employees, artists, service providers, service providers' employees, etc.) must wear a visible identification badge. These badges are issued under the authority of the CCPB Director, by the

security service for each event or intervention, and are valid only for the time and place specified therein. will assume full responsibility for any such expulsion and all its consequences, including contractual ones.

Repetition of these infringements would be considered as serious misconduct justifying the termination of commercial relations to the exclusive detriment of the beneficiary or service provider concerned.

Article 36 - Security

In general, CCPB beneficiaries and service providers are required to comply with and ensure compliance by their employees and service providers under their responsibility, throughout the period of use of the premises, with legal and regulatory requirements relating to safety, working at heights, fire safety, and in particular those applicable in establishments open to the public (ERP). He respects and ensures compliance with the standards applicable to his activity, in particular those laid down in the French Public Health Code.

Article 37 - Dress code

The beneficiary shall require all persons present on the premises to be impeccably dressed.

Article 38 - Alcohol

Service providers serving alcoholic beverages are responsible for their customers' state with regard to alcohol. They are forbidden to give drinks to people who are obviously drunk.

Service providers must take constant care to avoid selling the same customer quantities of alcohol that would put him or her in breach of the Highway Code.

The sale of alcohol to minors is prohibited. Failure to comply with these rules may result in the closure of the CCPB's sales outlets, to the detriment of the offender.
